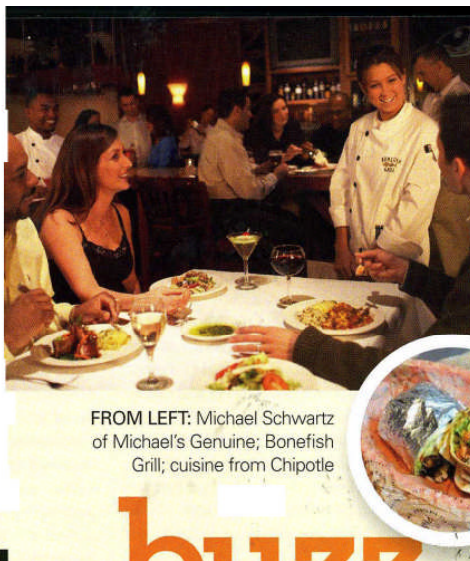

Buzz always has wondered about naming a seafood restaurant for a fish that eats like a mouthful of porcupine, but that hasn't stopped **Bonefish Grill** from spawning more than 130 establishments across the country, including its latest edition in the Boca Grove Shopping Center in Boca Raton.

Perhaps it's because, unlike the bonefish, eating at Bonefish Grill doesn't hurt so much; prices for its eight or so varieties of fresh fish and shellfish rarely break the \$20 barrier. Buzz likes the grill's keep-it-simple, have-it-your-way concept, too—cook most everything on a wood-burning grill, and offer your choice of fish with your choice of sauce. The 5,000-square-foot space is fairly swimming in handblown amber glass lamps and giant metal sculptures, plus the now-standard open kitchen and pair of communal tables for a few dozen close, personal friends. It seems quite the place to sea and be scene.
